- •Upon completion of the course, trained volunteers will be issued a C.O.P. Photo ID card with lanyard to display while on patrol.



TRAINING

The purpose of the COP program is to

prepare COP members to be the "EYES and EARS" of the Bexar County Sheriff's Office, and to promote closer cooperation between residents and the BCSO. The training program consists of 4 hours of classroom training and the opportunity for 8 hours of ride-along with an experienced district patrol deputy in a patrol vehicle

During the classroom training sessions, volunteers are trained by the Bexar County Deputy Sheriffs to recognize suspicious activities that may lead to crime in their neighborhoods.
